REFORMATION SUNDAY

The term "Reformed" is an historical term that refers to a period when the church underwent a Reformation in attempting to return Christianity to the authority of scripture. The desire of the Reformation was not to change God's word but rather to bring the church back into accord with it. Led by Martin Luther and John Calvin, the Reformation churches split off from the errors of the medieval Roman church and began what we know today as Protestantism. The Church celebrates Reformation Sunday on the last Sunday of October, commemorating a significant event in the history of the Reformed tradition. It was on October 31, 1517, that Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the door of the church in Wittenberg protesting abuses in the church.
